DECLARATION OF *mothers*

A PROCLAMATION AND A PLEDGE FOR THE PRESERVATION OF LIBERTY & VIRTUE

As the mothers and primary *Makers* of the *Homes* of America—the molders of the future of our nation—we declare that the liberty and freedom of all people *begin* in the home and that a nation is but a magnified home. The values and virtues taught within the family will determine the values and virtues of the nation as a whole.

We recognize the sacred role of mother as the heart of the home and home as the heart of society. The liberty of each individual begins in the home and parents are, first and foremost, the primary teachers and protectors of their children in a free society. Properly constructed social, religious, and governmental institutions are designed to support and strengthen the family unit, not replace it or regulate it. No association or government organization can replace the family no matter how well-intentioned or well-designed it may be.

The privilege of living as a free people in a free society is dependent on being a people of faith, virtue and patriotism—the three pillars of liberty—and these attributes are best developed and nurtured in the home. Each generation has a responsibility to instill a love of liberty and virtue in the hearts of the next generation.

We affirm that "All men and women are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights and to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, [receiving] their just powers from the consent of the governed."¹

To secure the blessings of liberty, the Founding Fathers of the United States of America created a written constitution under the inspiration of Almighty God. The preservation of this sacred document and trust is dependent upon each generation, who bears the

stewardship of safeguarding the constitution and teaching their children the rights and responsibilities associated with the noble cause of liberty and keeping the Republic.

Every individual is born with intrinsic dignity that is inherent to each member of the human race. All men and women have the right to liberty, self-determination and self-governance. The individual's responsibility of work, education, and industry are crucial elements of self-governance in society and the preservation of human dignity.

The rights of a free people are protected and preserved through honorable, virtuous, leadership which invokes the nobility inherent in all men and women. Successful leaders in the home and family govern by correct principles, teach by example and stand for self-evident truths and liberty sustaining principles.

As the lessons of history clearly demonstrate, we recognize that freedom is fragile. It is a rare and prized possession and requires constant care and vigilance for its preservation. Living as a free people does not come instinctively; principles of freedom must be studied and applied. Home and families with mothers who nurture and teach these principles produce leaders who honor and hold sacred the intrinsic dignity of the individual and inalienable rights endowed to all people.

To safeguard the liberty and enhance the future of our children and grandchildren, we affirm our commitment to "stand fast in that liberty wherewith God has made us free"² that "government of the people, by the people, and for the people shall not perish from the earth."³

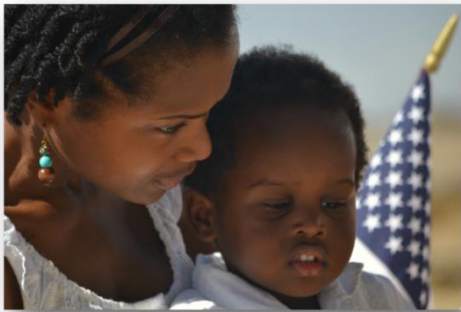
MOTHERHOOD IS NOT A BURDEN!

It is clear there is a direct attack on motherhood today. What many women don't realize however is why. The simple answer is, those who would destroy liberty, family, and all we hold dear know how powerful our influence is as mothers and they need us out of the way.

Each year the United Nations holds a Commission on the Status of Women where representatives from hundreds of countries meet to negotiate a document of "agreed conclusions" which every country is expected to adopt. While the document is not legally binding, it is considered "soft international law" because it impacts social norms, public policy and decision-makers around the world. This year the big push by radical feminists from the United States and European nations was to classify motherhood as "unpaid work," declaring it a burden that needs to be recognized, reduced and redistributed. Of course that means more government intervention, more taxes to pay for that intervention, and more condemnation of our men and boys.

In the annual letter from the Gates Foundation (Feb 2017) Melinda Gates said, "the real issue isn't how much time women spend on unpaid work—it's how much time they don't spend contributing to society and pursuing higher education or a career." She further stated that given the opportunity women would "spend more time doing paid work, starting businesses, or otherwise contributing to the economic well-being of societies around the world. The fact that they can't, holds their families and communities back."

This is not only incredibly belittling to mothers; it completely disregards the fact that the most influential person in society is the mother because of her influence in the home. If motherhood wasn't such a powerful influence, why would the United Nations be spending so much time trying to belittle it?



A nation is but a magnified home. If we want to know what America will look like in 10 or 20 years, we just need to look at the homes of America today. Home is the center of society and mothers are the center of the home.

In today's cultural climate, promoting a foundation of liberty and virtue in the home has become vital to our nation's survival.
